



God is Good, Trust Him

Last Sunday I mentioned a big theological word –

theodicy – which deals with the topic of God's justice. The most common question of theodicy is, "Why does a God who is infinitely good, all-powerful, and perfectly just allow evil and suffering to exist."

If that sounds strange or offensive towards God, fear not. God knows that we struggle with difficult questions, especially during difficult times in our lives, and He allows us to ask those questions. There does, however, come a point, like we see near the end of the book of Job, when God says to us, "Who do you think you are? Enough is enough. I am God, you are not. Trust Me."

In my own life, I have found it helpful to ask a different set of questions – of myself. Instead of spinning my wheels in the muddy ruts of the problems of evil, pain, and existentialism, I ask of myself:

"Do I believe God is good, and do I trust Him?"

We can believe God is good and trust Him without having perfect answers to all of life's most difficult questions. If you think about it, trust often implies a lack of full-disclosure. In other words, we are forced to make decisions about trust when we don't have all of the information.

Nevertheless, the age-old theodicy question is certainly a fair one. How do we deal with tragedy, injustice, or the loss of a seemingly innocent person, especially when we can find nothing redemptive in it? Or find no reason for it?

Instead of over-reacting and pushing God to the side, perhaps these thoughts will help us to be honest about our struggles with theodicy while giving God our belief and trust at the same time.

- Acknowledge the fact that tragedies are hard and in many ways life is never the same as a result. C.S. Lewis, when he lost his wife to cancer, described himself as a ship which used to have both port and starboard engines which now "chugs along somehow" with only the port engine. (*A Grief Observed*, 33-34)
- Take the time you need, and allow others the time they need to adjust to the "new normal." We eventually get back in the game, knowing that we might get beat up, bruised, or worse.
- In Christ, we can have hope that things can get better. Yahweh is the God of the brokenhearted, and He too is grieved over the deep "wrongness" that exists in our world. He has promised us that it will not be this way forever, and that if we continue to follow Jesus, He will lead us to eternal life where brokenness will no longer be an issue.

Do you believe God is good, and do you trust Him?




