



God Is In Control

Last Sunday I introduced "Church Matters," during which I shared my heart about Who we should represent in the upcoming election season. If you did not hear my talk or read my Channel article, both are available at ericcostanzo.me.

In every election season, there are always many voices calling out for our attention. Often times, the extreme voices on either side seem convinced that their person or party will heal all of our ills, and that the other side's person or party will lead us to our ultimate destruction. I am confident that our "fate" is not in the hands of any person or party, and I choose not to ever put my faith in a human or human institution above God - Who I believe to be actually in control.

I am reminded of what St. Augustine wrote, which has been restated by many who have followed, including the Reformers, regarding our responsibility as Christians to be good citizens while remaining true to our biblical roots. In *City of God*, arguably one of the top 5 most important Christian writings of all time, Augustine addressed several issues facing both Christian and non-Christian citizens who lived in the crumbling Roman Empire.

Augustine reminded the Christians of his day that their hopes would neither be fulfilled



nor dashed by any human being(s). Their ultimate trust was to be in God, and God alone. Only He could deliver them from the darkness that seemed to be enveloping their culture and threatening their security.

Augustine also implored his fellow-believers to proclaim their undeniable allegiance to the eternal Kingdom of God over the temporal kingdom of earth. He argued that God's people should always be consumed with pleasing Him first, as opposed to being self-serving and earthly-focused. With our focus on God and His Kingdom, Augustine said, we are not dependent on anything a human can or cannot do.

As a result, we are free to follow the instructions of another great Christ-follower, the Apostle Peter: "Show proper respect to everyone, love the family of believers, fear God, honor the emperor" (1 Peter 2:17).
