

That's Just the Way It Is, Pt. 2

Have you ever had one of those days where nothing seems to go right, even though your intentions are top shelf?

A few years ago after one of the blizzards, my kids and I were delivering groceries to a homebound family. The roads were still covered with snow and ice, and so we were slow and careful. We were on a benevolent mission, so surely there was no need to worry.

My confidence in our invincibility was soon shattered, however, as we left the main roads, entered a neighborhood, and quickly got stuck. Friends and strangers came to help, and we spent many painful hours raucously trying to free our stranded vehicle. To this day, our minivan has never been the same.

We were back in business, and we continued on to our destination. When we arrived, however, we learned quickly that we had been looking for the wrong address all along. Not cool. Things don't always go the way we think they should.

As we conclude the Book of Jonah this morning, it is clear Jonah has had enough. He feels a deep wrong has been done towards him. Every choice he made ended in disappointment, while his enemies were given a merciful reprieve. When Jonah tried to do things his way, God foiled his plans. When he obeyed and did things God's way, the results made Jonah feel even worse. In his own mind, Jonah was experiencing a no-win situation. He was caught between his own Scylla and Charybdis (feel free to look that one up).

Thus while Jeremiah has been called "the weeping prophet," Jonah has been called "the pouting prophet." When God turns away from His anger, Jonah becomes angry and throws a temper tantrum. Jonah was angry because the Ninevites did not get what they deserved.

Well, Jonah was definitely right on that point. Thanks be to God, neither do we! For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord (Romans 6:23).

Singing Churchmen of Oklahoma




South Tulsa Baptist Church will host the Singing Churchmen of Oklahoma in concert on Thursday, October 20 at 7:00 p.m. These men represent
