

The Shema - Week 1

In my opinion, no other passage in Scripture better describes what it means to live out God's message everywhere and at all times than the

Jesus was asked, "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?"

Jesus answered with a verse from the Shema.

The Shema is the passage of Scripture every Jewish adult and child, both then and now, knows best of all. The Shema is like a pledge of allegiance - a pledge that God is the One True God. The Shema is to a Jewish believer what John 3:16 is to a Christian. Orthodox Jews say the Shema upon rising in the morning, before meals, in worship, and before going to bed at night. The Shema is the first prayer a Jewish child is taught to pray, and the last words one hopes to say before death.

So what is the Shema? The Shema comes from **Deuteronomy 6** as Moses is preparing the younger generation of Israelites to enter the Promised Land - a land Moses would not enter himself. In Hebrew, the word shema means, "hear". **Deuteronomy 6:4** begins with this word..."Hear."

Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. Tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates (Deuteronomy 6:4-9).

For the next five Sundays, we will look at the Shema together in our morning messages and in my Channel columns. This most central and pivotal of all Old Testament Scriptures teaches us that we, as God's people, must learn to love and serve Him with every part of us with our heads, hearts, hands, homes, and our whole lives.


Dina is one of our young helpers, she is extremely happy because she found out that she is getting

Commitment

Commitment seems to be a word of antiquity these days, or at least it seems that fewer people are willing to fully dedicate themselves to something or even worse someone. to show the world there is someone worth committing to. We must resolve to live with complete dedication which points to a powerful savior. The only hope for a hurting world is to show them that a commitment to Christ is a path paved with joy and freedom! Therefore, place your life in the lap of Jesus and experience true life with an eternal purpose!
