



I Am Not Ashamed of the Good News, Pt. 1 of 3

Romans 1:16: "For I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes: first to the Jew, then to the Gentile."

The gospel – the good news about life in Jesus - is to be a source of joy and courage for us, not cause for shame. The gospel comes from God Himself, and is good news because everyone who believes it will receive God's salvation the only true hope for human beings before and after death. Paul, who wrote these words, also said that this is good news for Jew and Gentile alike. The good news is for everyone.

Who would be ashamed of that?

Well clearly Paul felt that being ashamed of the good news about Jesus was a temptation. If we are honest, many of us have also struggled at times with being embarrassed or ashamed about our faith in Jesus.

I would argue, however, that our reasons for being ashamed of the gospel in 21st Century America are much different than those of Paul's 1st Century audience.

There are many differences, for instance, in how we experience persecution. But, there is also so much more. In the context of the first century Roman Empire, this verse takes on an entirely different meaning that is easy to miss.

In first century Rome, it was not too flattering to be named along with Jesus of Nazareth - whether among Jews or Gentiles. Among the Jews, Jesus was a blasphemer and fraud. Among the Romans, Jesus had been executed with odious criminals, and as a criminal Himself. Jesus and His teaching were an affront to multiple "kingdoms." Thus, the 1st Century Christians had to decide which kingdom to serve first.

Will you and I ever have to make that choice? Which kingdom do we serve first? If our commitment to any earthly kingdom makes us feel ashamed to live boldly in and for God's Kingdom, Romans 1:16 has an even deeper meaning.

Prove It

Prove it! We've all heard those words. They are usually words that come after one child makes an extremely bold claim to a friend who is apprehensive about the truthfulness of his claim. It's natural for us to want to see evidence. There are a lot of bold statements made in this world. and the natural response to most of them is, prove it!

There is no bolder statement than the message of Christ! The claim that Jesus was God in flesh, who died and rose from the grave is by far the most bodacious claim in all of history. But, people want to see more verbal or written evidence. What they want is for you to prove it!

Francis of Assisi was attributed as saying, "Preach the gospel at all times; when necessary, use words." This statement though is only half true, because we know that a person must hear the gospel in order to believe. Romans 10:17 tells us that "faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ." So the reality is that we are not preaching the gospel unless we are using words! But, we must also never forget the other side of the equation, the Word without a changed life lacks the ability to prove it.

Often times what Christians don't realize is that the world wants to believe something. We must understand that if we merely regurgitate a mass of facts with little to no change in our lives, our message becomes deflated and lacks the power to convince the onlooking world of what we say we believe is true. The world will stop and stare if they see a group of people who prove what they are saying by transformed lives. The only hope that we might "Prove it" to the world, is if they see Him in us! And, the only way they will see Him in us is if He has made His home in our heart, and we have made our home in His Word! So, make a bold statement by declaring the gospel with your words, but live in such a way that your transformed life will "Prove it" to the onlooking world!
